## Our Role in Public Safety



### Supplemental Patrols

Since 2018, the CID has funded off-duty officer patrols to increase visibility and provide direct support to our stakeholders.

### License Plate Reader (LPR) Technology

CID-funded LPRs in Tucker have played a key role in identifying suspects who might have otherwise evaded capture.

### Partnerships with Local Government

The CID supports changes to local laws that improve conditions for commercial property owners — making the area less attractive to criminals and more inviting to customers.

### Advocating for Stakeholders

The CID regularly shares the needs and concerns of local businesses with law enforcement, ensuring that those who invest in the area have a strong voice in public safety decisions.
